








Congressional Support to Challenge Electors

Supreme Court Amicus Brief on Texas suit against Pennsylvania

- More than 125 House Republicans have now signed on to an amicus brief backing a lawsuit from Texas to the Supreme Court seeking to overturn the results of the election in the states of Pennsylvania, Michigan, Wisconsin and Georgia. Amicus signers are indicated as "Y" under "Amicus." Under Link, "<none found>" indicates a specific search was done on that member; if blank, a specific search has not been done.
